## Research into Secondary provision for SEND

Southampton Advisory Outreach Service conducted a piece of research into secondary provision for SEND across Southampton over a twelve month period. The findings are now available on the SIP website.

**"This short piece of action research seeks to identify the strengths of secondary school provision for students with SEND, in order to provide a city wide overview in which good practice and expertise can be shared. It also considers the particular barriers faced by secondary schools and examines how schools are working to overcome these barriers. The research suggests that despite the challenges of reduced funding, some schools are developing innovative ways to maximise resources and provide flexible pathways of provision for pupils with SEND..."**

## Teaching School Hubs

The six pilot Teaching School Hubs have recently been announced: <http://bit.ly/35CaJX9> .

There is not a hub in our area (South East South London SESL) although Amanda Parry, as Regional Lead will be kept informed of developments through the TSC. All Teaching Schools will be kept updated via a regional newsletter and information will continue to be shared via this newsletter. Whilst these six hubs remain part of the Test and Learn pilot and we learn from this model, there is no change to the way teaching schools in SESL operate and funding has been committed to existing Teaching Schools until at least April 2021.

## Engagement Model

You will be aware that as from September 2020, P Levels will no longer be used to assess pupils working at levels 1-4.

The Engagement Model will become statutory from September 2020 which uses a very different assessment approach to P-scales. Five areas of engagement (exploration, realisation, anticipation, participation and initiation) will be used as an assessment tool in conjunction with schools' internal assessment processes.

The information received is that the DfE is not currently expecting data to be submitted but the names of pupils involved in the Engagement Model will be required. Ofsted are involved in writing the guidance and will form part of the Quality of Education judgement.

Training will take place in the Spring term to ensure there are lead trainers across each region with the full programme of training being rolled out across the region during the summer term. This training will be free and the expectation is that at least one representative from all primary and special schools should attend.

Southampton Inclusion Partnership are attending the Train the Trainer event on March 20th after which further details will be shared.
